NOTIFICATION

New Delhi-11, the 30th May, 1968/9th Jyaistha, 1980

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the Foreigners Act, 1946 (31 of 1946), the Central Government hereby directs that notwithstanding anything contained in the Foreigners (Exemption) Order, 1957, no foreigner shall remain in *Clement Town* and Rajpur in Dehra Dun District in the State of Uttar Pradesh for a period of more than seven days unless he has obtained permission in writing from the District Magistrate, Dehra Dun, or such other officer as may be authorised by him in this behalf.

Provided that the provisions of this Order shall not apply to, or in relation to, any foreigner -

- (i) who has been ordinarily resident in Clement Town or Rajpur, as the case may be, for a period of not less than five years immediately before the date of publication of this Order in the Official Gazette; or

(ii) who is a subject of Bhutan or Sikkim or is a national of Nepal.
